Rules of the Game:

Organize your team in an ascending number line, the team that arranges themselves fastest, wins Players must not take off their post-it notes themselves to see which number they have been assigned Step 1: Split all the players into equally numbered teams. For example, if there are 18 players, split them into 3 teams of 6 players each. Step 2: Stick a post-it note with a number on the back of each child in each team. These numbers can be anywhere between 100-500. Step 3: Ask each team to organize themselves in a number line from smallest to largest, according to the numbers they have been assigned. Step 4: The first team to organize themselves in an ascending number line wins the game. An example of numbering post-it notes, assuming that there are 6 players: Illustrations

	122 or 500 minus 37. This way a player would have to first add or subtract to
	calculate the assigned number for each player in their team.

Simplification	The game can be played with either smaller teams or smaller numbers
