5. Select the three most important characteristics of your country. Explain why they are the most important.

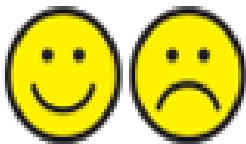
6. Can you name at least two different animals and describe how they have adapted to their environment (e.g., desert, rainforest, polar regions)?
