"The red cap

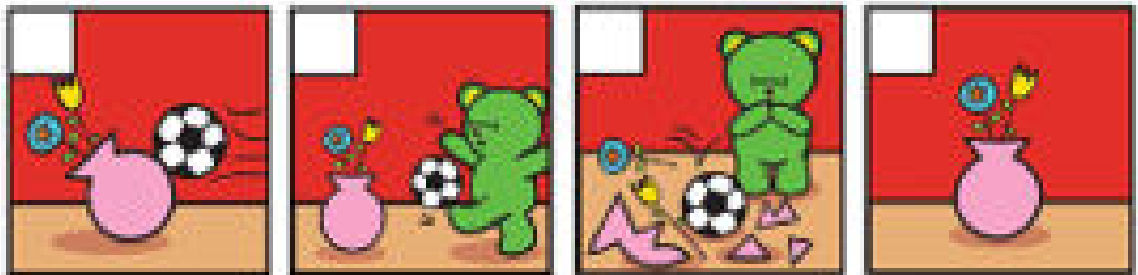
Began to flap
